

16th Annual Day of Caring



The Day of Caring brings volunteers and non-profit organizations together to work on important community service projects. Participating in these projects promotes a greater understanding of community needs and provides excellent team-building opportunities. This event also helps health and human service agencies better serve their clients by allowing them to focus their resources on front-line services.

Led by **Chuck Dickinson**, Chair of the Volunteer Committee, over 60 volunteers completed 12 projects including: extensive landscape work at the **Senior Activity Center**, painting a long hallway at the **Salvation Army**, helping the people of **King's Daughters Apartments** to have clean living spaces, cleaning trails at the **Salato Wildlife Center**, scraping and preparing cages for painting at the **Humane Society**, planting a garden and cleaning & painting the front and back porches at the **SIMON House**, tilling a garden at the **Beta Halfway House**, cleaning and painting the foundation, outdoor benches and a shed at the **Thorn Hill Education Center**, and building two large free-standing shelves at the **American Red Cross** for them to store emergency supplies.
